HER LIFE WAS SAVED, NOW SHE SAVES LIVES "

My entry into the world was to a drug addicted and abusive father and a young mother who divorced him. I felt like a leaf torn from a tree, disconnected from everything and without any roots. I left home and lived on the street. I abused drugs and was being abused. I was homeless with no family to care for me. After being placed in a homeless shelter and then an institution, my social worker brought me to Beit Ruth. I was 14 years old. The first thing I noticed was the smell. It was like what home should smell like. It looked and felt like Shabbat at my grandma's house.

I was cared for by women who wanted to see me succeed, heal, learn, and grow, and who saw my potential. And more importantly, they wanted me to see it too. For the first time, I felt empowered and saw a future for myself that I could be proud of.

Beit Ruth gave me the desire to give back to the world. Today, I am an Emergency Room Nurse at Hadassah Hospital in Jerusalem, a wife, and the proud mother of three young girls.

My life completely changed because of Beit Ruth. What I am most thankful for is breaking the cycle of generational abuse so my three daughters will never have to know a life of fear, a life of harm, a life on the streets, and a life that is not worth living. Instead, they will know love.

FROM LOST TRUST TO HOPE FOUND - REBUILDING YOUNG GIRLS' FAITH IN THE WORLD

he Beit Ruth Educational & Therapeutic Village is a safe and nurturing haven for girls ages 13 to 18 who have been removed from their homes by court order by Israel's Ministry of Welfare due to severe neglect, or physical, emotional, and sexual abuse. Here, they find a safe, structured, and loving home environment, and the academic and therapeutic resources they need to build a better future. They emerge with the necessary life, educational, and social and emotional skills needed to live fulfilling lives and to become empowered, responsible, and engaged members of society.



Beit Ruth: Pioneers in Healing Girls At-Risk

The Beit Ruth model was specifically designed to address the needs of young women and girls who are vulnerable, abused, and neglected. Our holistic framework of FOUR INTERCONNECTED PILLARS are a model for rehabilitative care that is provided by our all-female staff of professionals who are specially trained in treating complex posttrauma. Because each girl has her own story, an individualized plan is created to meet every girl's therapeutic and academic needs, and social and emotional capabilities. It is this combination of innovative, unique, and nurturing programming that defines Beit Ruth.

In 2020, Beit Ruth welcomed its 4th cohort of Shinshinyot (young Israelis who defer IDF service) who live in the Village for 1 year. They are Big Sisters to our girls and provide academic, program, and home-life support.

An independent study of Beit Ruth alumnae conducted in 2019 by Dr. Gila Amitai, Max Stern Yezreel Valley Academic College in Israel, found, "Beit Ruth prepares girls for the future, empowering them to be independent, excel academically, to be leaders, and to be part of the social change that contributes to ending the cycle of generational abuse."

HOME LIFE



With a foundation of family-like support and stability - often for the first time - girls experience a sense of safety and inclusion. Each house is a home to 15 girls and is staffed by a loving team of house managers, social workers, and counselors. Our experts ensure that our girls' physical and emotional needs are met and that they never feel abandoned again. They also shape their character by instilling important life values. Girls cook together, share meals, and spend time with each other, allowing them to forge strong bonds that can last a lifetime.

Our girls represent Israel's rich cultural, ethnic, and religious diversity, and learn about and celebrate multicultural holidays together.

EDUCATION

Beit Ruth High # School named # OUTSTANDING SCHOOL in 2020 by Israel's Ministry of Welfare 95% of girls who live at Beit Ruth until the age of 18 earn a high school diploma

Girls who endured neglect and abuse are unable to focus in school – 90% come to us with significant gaps in their education. Thanks to our team of educators, they achieve grade level within 6 months. Girls cultivate learning habits, as well as creative and critical thinking and problem-solving skills that influence their future. *At Beit Ruth, every girl benefits from individualized attention and a demanding curriculum.* This focused approach restores a love of learning, and the determination and confidence to succeed. Our girls score above the national average on Israel's matriculation exams!

THERAPY

Girls arrive to Beit Ruth with traumas associated with severe abuse. Each girl receives an individualized therapy plan based on her emotional needs and works with an onsite clinical social worker specially trained in complex post-trauma. During therapy, our girls build psychological and emotional resilience to overcome trauma while restoring their strength, self-esteem, and confidence. This process empowers each girl with the emotional resources needed to work through the obstacles that once limited her potential.

"I thought I deserved it. Maybe if I was good, my parents wouldn't have been alcoholics. I thought I was going to be

Arriving at Beit Ruth with no trust or self-esteem, programs like Art Therapy, Music Therapy, Sports (i.e., dance, volleyball), Animal-Assisted Therapy, *Acharai* (an IDF preparatory course), and many more, equip girls with practical skills, including communications, leadership, and teamwork, as well as resources to become healthy, resilient, and confident. Educational Field Trips to Jerusalem, Masada, the Dead Sea, and elsewhere, teach our girls about Israel's history and allow them to feel a connection to their country. They begin to understand their place in the world.



A few days before Israel was ordered to shelter-in-place because of COVID-19, Beit Ruth staff took action to ensure that girls enjoyed a great day outdoors. With special permission from the police, they packed up and headed to Mount Hermon in Northern Israel. For many girls, it was their first time seeing snow and they loved building snowmen and creating snow angels. They also learned about the historical significance of the region.

Each girl spends one-on-one time with a personal volunteer who helps to mentor her.

Sara: From a life on the streets to a loving caregiver

Sara came to Israel from Russia with her mother at the age of 9. Neglected and left virtually alone, Sara descended into a life in the streets. She was found in a police station after a violent assault by a criminal gang. When she arrived at Beit Ruth, Sara was suffering from deep trauma. She was completely withdrawn, distancing herself from the staff and the other girls. After two years at Beit Ruth, she began to excel at school, and exude positivity and confidence. Today, she is giving back by working as a caregiver for the elderly. She is also a loving mother to her young daughter.

Dina: From flashbacks of abuse to attending university

After five placements – the last one a lockdown facility – Dina was 15 when she arrived at Beit Ruth. With a history of running away, Beit Ruth staff made an agreement with Dina that, no matter what, she would not run away; instead, she would talk with her social worker. For the first time, Dina felt people were telling her the truth and she honored her agreement. A good student, Dina suffered from test anxiety.

When she revealed that during exams, she would experience flashbacks of physical abuse by her father when she did not meet his expectations, staff worked with her to ease her anxiety. Today, Dina manages a large clothing store in Tel Aviv and is studying toward her matriculation exams in order to attend university.

Rachel: From hopelessness to IDF combat soldier

The child of alcoholic parents, Rachel was raised by her grandmother, who locked her in the house in an attempt to protect her. Rachel and her sister ran away from home and after attempting to commit suicide, Rachel was hospitalized. The doctors said that she reacted normally to an abnormal situation. When Rachel first arrived at Beit Ruth, we understood why she was suspicious and untrusting of everyone. After a few months, and for the first time, we began to see Rachel smile, engage, and go on to become an excellent student and a leader. We celebrated when she successfully completed her high school matriculation exams and joined the IDF. She is now serving in a highly responsible position in a combat unit in the Israeli army, where her commanders give her high praise.

he global pandemic could have had greater debilitating effects on our girls who already suffer from trauma and heightened anxiety; however, the stabilizing programs Beit Ruth provides every day went into overdrive, helping them to feel safe and calm. In fact, the Israeli government recognized Beit Ruth's expertise, designating us as an "essential" organization that allowed us to stay fully open and operational! Beit Ruth's academic programming operated in learning "pods" while most schools in Israel were forced to close.

During unprecedented times, with help from partners and friends, Beit Ruth was able to:

- Provide food and resources to Alumnae who suddenly found themselves unemployed
- Send care packages to relatives of our girls who were experiencing food insecurity
- Celebrate Passover with the largest (we think!) seder in Israel
- Keep our community connected through virtual programming

In 2020 alone, Beit Ruth was featured in Israel21C, Times of Israel, and the Los Angeles Jewish Journal. Through our **Advocacy & Outreach Initiative**, Beit Ruth leverages our hands-on expertise to educate multiple stakeholders. At our **Center of Knowledge**, housed within our onsite High School, we host dozens of seminars and workshops each year, and share our best practices.


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And that's who this is all for - the many girls who call Beit Ruth home and the many more who


